

NOTE REGARDING

DIFFERENTIATED REGISTRATION FEES AT TSE

• What are the differentiated registration fees?

As part of the implementation of the <u>« Bienvenue en France »</u> strategy from the 2019-2020 academic year, **international students**, **nationals of countries outside the European Union**, are required to pay specific registration fees, which apply instead of the "classic" registration fees, i.e. the total amounts below for one year (tariffs in force for the 2024-2025 academic year).

NB: differentiated registration fees do not apply to TSE's international Master's programs. All students admitted into these programs are expected to pay a total of 5,853 €, as detailed below, independently of their nationalities.

^{*}The CVEC must be paid before enrollment, <u>directly to the dedicated institution here</u>. Exemptions from the CVEC are possible.

Are all non-EU students necessarily affected by those fees?

No, you can be automatically exempted if you qualify to at least one of the conditions listed on <u>pages 2 and 3</u>. In this case, <u>no request</u> is needed. The exemption will be granted upon presentation of the supporting documents, when compiling your administrative registration file (online or in person).

• If I do not benefit from an automatic exemption, can I request one?

Yes, every year TSE offers fee waivers to several students **based on academic excellence**. These criteria are detailed on page 4.

If you can show <u>multiple</u> supporting documents demonstrating the criteria, you can ask for a fee exemption to TSE's Admissions Office.

• I do not benefit from any exemption. May I pay in several installments?

After transmitting your certificate of payment for the CVEC, you will be asked to pay, in order to finalise your enrollment, at least **one third of the total requested amount**, namely 950 € for an enrollment in a Bachelor's degree, 1,293 € for a Master's degree standard track, and 1,917 € for a Master's degree international track. You will be offered the option **of paying in three installments**, both online and during an in-person appointment. The payment can only be made by **debit card** (no credit card). The 2nd and 3rd installments will be debited the following two months.

Situations granting **an automatic exemption**of the differentiated registration fees

NATIONALITY

- ✓ I am a citizen of:
 - a state from the European Union,
 - a state from the European Economic Area (Norway, Island, Liechtenstein),
 - Andorra, Monaco, Switzerland or Quebec;
- ✓ My home state has concluded an **international agreement applicable to the Republic of France** providing for the payment of registration fees similar to those applicable to French citizens or exempting citizens of that state from holding a residence permit in France;

MY ENROLLMENT SITUATION IN 2025/2026

- ✓ I am enrolling in a **CPGE** (preparatory class for the Grandes Ecoles) offering a double enrollment in one of **TSE's Bachelor's degree**;
- ✓ I am enrolling in one of TSE's Masters' degree international track: list of international programs
- ✓ I am enrolling at TSE thanks to an **exchange program or agreement**;
- ✓ I am enrolling solely in a "**Diplôme Universitaire**" delivered by TSE;
- ✓ I am enrolling in a **Doctoral track program** or an accreditation to direct research (**HDR**);
- ✓ I am enrolling with an Apprenticeship contract;

- ✓ I am enrolling in one of the programs listed below, managed by TSE's Open Distance Learning Office (FOAD):
 - → Master 2 mention économétrie, statistiques, parcours type économétrie, statistiques (FOAD) ;
 - → Diplôme d'université (DU) Statistique appliquée (FOAD) ;

MY STATUS IN FRANCE

- ✓ I hold a resident permit stating « *Carte de séjour de membre de la famille d'un citoyen de l'Union/EEE/Suisse* » (residence permit for a family member of a citizen of the European Union/EEA/Switzerland);
- ✓ I hold a residence permit, a resident permit stating **« résident de longue durée-UE »** (longterm residency-EU) or a similar permit issued under an international agreement applicable to the Republic of France;
- ✓ I am less than 18 years old and a direct or dependent descendant of the beneficiary of either a resident's card, a resident's card stating « résident de longue durée-UE » (long-term resident-EU) or a similar document issued under an international agreement applicable to the Republic of France;
- ✓ I have declared my tax household in France for at least 2 years as of January 1st 2025 (notices of assessment for 2024 and 2025);
- ✓ I have been attached to a tax household in France for at least 2 years as of January 1st 2025 (notices of assessment for 2024 and 2025 and related tax income);
- ✓ I have the refugee or subsidiary protection status;
- ✓ One of my parents (or my legal guardian) has the refugee or subsidiary protection status.

FRENCH GOVERNMENT SCHOLARSHIPS AND EMBASSY EXEMPTIONS

- ✓ I hold a scholarship of the French government (BGF status);
- ✓ I hold a **scholarship from the French embassy** of my home country.
- → If you can **show proof that you fit one of the situations described above**, you do not need to apply for an exemption: it will be granted automatically. Simply submit your documents when registering online or hand them in at your in-person appointment.

Requesting an exemption from differentiated tuition fees based on academic excellence

Please find below the criteria which are taken into account:

Bachelor's degree level:

- High marks in the core subjects of the Bachelor's program in relation to the class/cohort average or mainly corresponding to A and B in a letter grading system;
- A C1 level certificate in the French language (CECRL);
- A prize obtained in an academic competition between students in a particular subject area;

Master's degree level:

- High marks in the core subjects of the Bachelor's program in relation to the class/cohort average or mainly corresponding to A and B in a letter grading system;
- A C1 level certificate in the French language (CECRL);
- A C1 level certificate in the English language and/or TOEFL scores higher than 95/120;
- A prize obtained in an academic competition between students in a particular subject area;
- GRE scores in « quantitative reasoning » at a quantile superior to 90%;
- Successful professional experience leading to unanimous recommendations from managers or the creation of a company.
- → A combination of these criteria is needed in order to apply for an exemption a single criterion will not be sufficient to accept your application. A pedagogical committee will assess all applications received.
